? Dowry - The rules of marriage have been misinterpreted and misused for maintaining the dowry system.

? This chart describes the various conditions that occur due to the negligence of women's health.

? Weight gain: Getting older can be triple whammy. Muscle is lost as age advances .At the same time body burns only few calories for the same physical activities as when you were younger. Gaining weight increases the risk of heart disease, hypertension, diabetes and stroke.

? Fragile bones: Many seniors fear facing advancing years affects your balance and makes less steady. Women of ages 50 and older are twice more likely than their male peers to break a bone because of their "brittle bone disease".

? PCOD: A hormone disorder causing enlarged ovaries with small cyst on the outer edges. The cause of polycystic ovary syndrome may involve a combination of genetic and environmental factors. Symptoms: Acne, Gaining weight, facial hair, difficulty in getting pregnant

? PMS: Pre Menstrual Syndrome. A group of symptoms occur in women, typically between ovulation & a period. The cause likely involves change in hormones during menstrual cycle. Symptoms: Mood swings, tender breasts, food cravings, fatigue,Irritability & depression

4. JANANI SHISHU SURAKSHA KARYAKARAM (2011)-it is mainly for delivery at health institute, transport service and child health

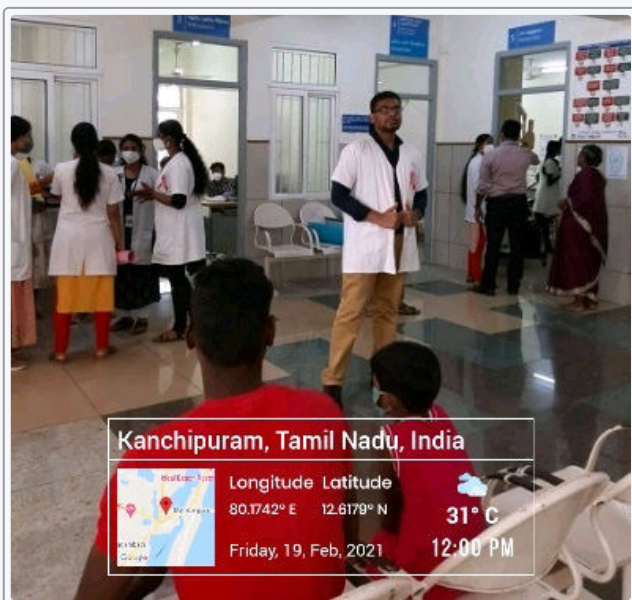
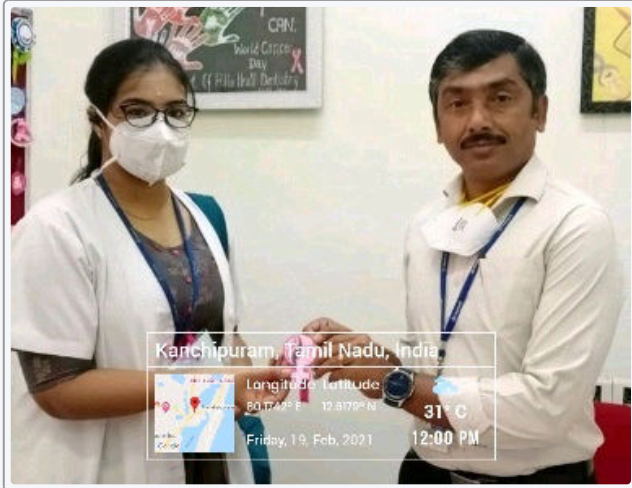

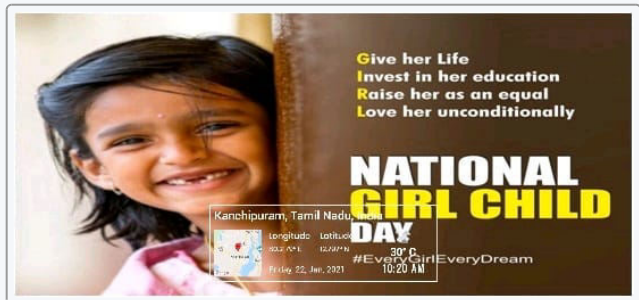
After this we came and reported to the department and shared our overall experience and our learning out come to our staff members and fellow people.

All the participants gave their valuable points on what was new on organizing and participating in the event and the overall learning out come.


Experience in participating-

Bioethics is the study of the ethical issues emerging from advances in biology, medicine and technologies. It proposes the discussion about moral discernment in society and it is often related to medical policy and practice, but also to broader questions as environment and well-being. Bioethics is concerned with the ethical questions that arise in the relationships among life sciences, biotechnology, medicine, politics, law, theology and philosophy. It includes the study of values relating to primary care, other branches of medicine ("the ethics of the ordinary"), ethical education in science, animal, and environmental ethics. Ethics also relates to many other sciences outside the realm of biological sciences and Bioethics is also claimed as a new ethic to answer complex questions of contemporary society.

Certain acts are regulated by communities to consider their legitimacy. Such regulation is called ethics. Bioethics include standards followed by us to regulate the activities linked with biological activities.

The Bioethics Program provides annual training in responsible conduct of research and sponsors workshops, seminars, and focus groups on ethical issues in environmental health research.

Bioethics is a rather young academic inter-disciplinary field that has emerged rapidly as a particular moral enterprise against the background of the revival of applied ethics in the second half of the twentieth century. The notion of bioethics is commonly understood as a generic term for three main sub-disciplines: medical ethics, animal ethics, and environmental ethics. Each sub-discipline has its own particular area of bioethics, but there is a significant overlap of many issues, ethical approaches, concepts, and moral considerations. This makes it difficult to examine and to easily solve vital moral problems such as abortion, xenotransplantation, cloning, stem cell research, the moral status of animals and the moral status of nature (the environment).

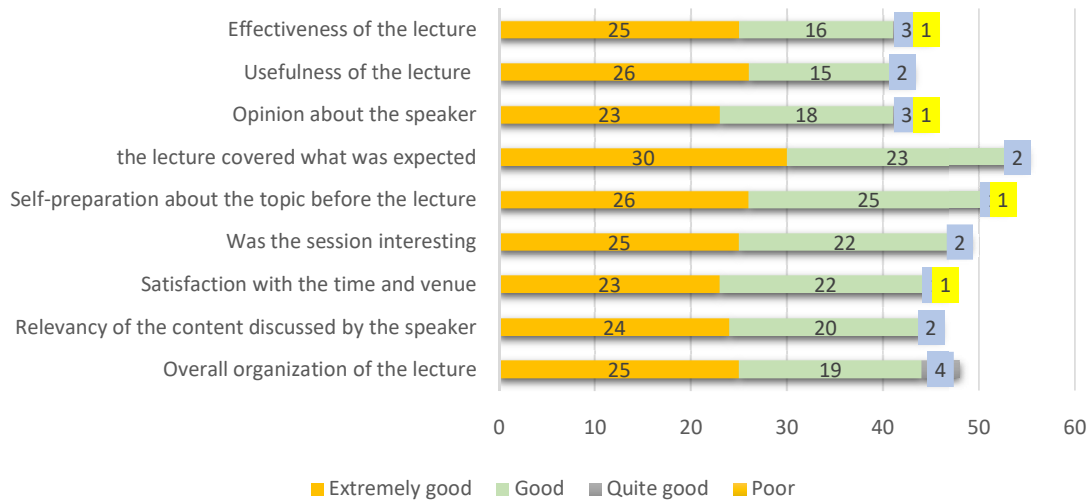
