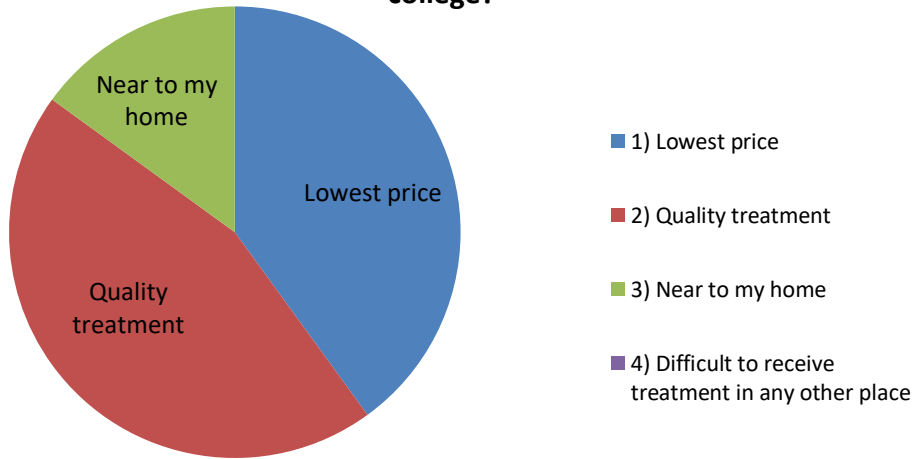
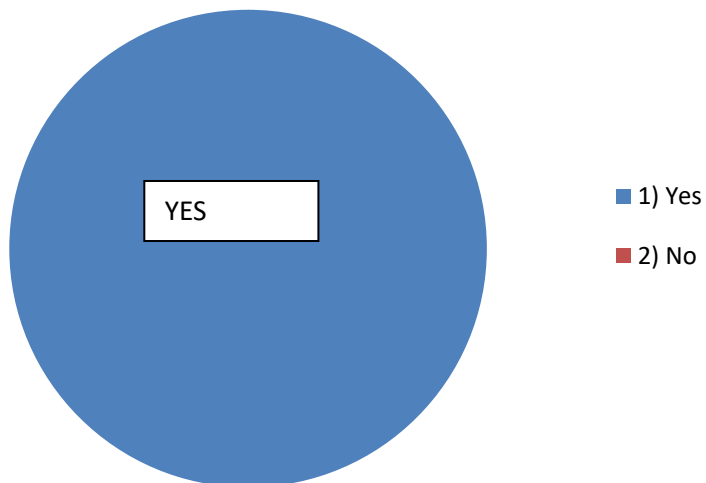

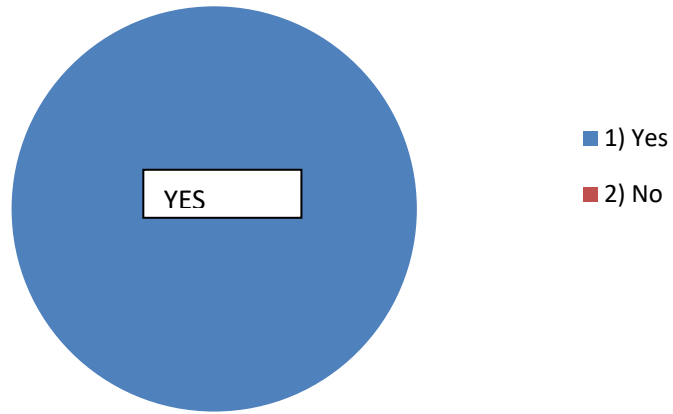
### 1. Reason to avail dental treatment at Chettinad dental college?



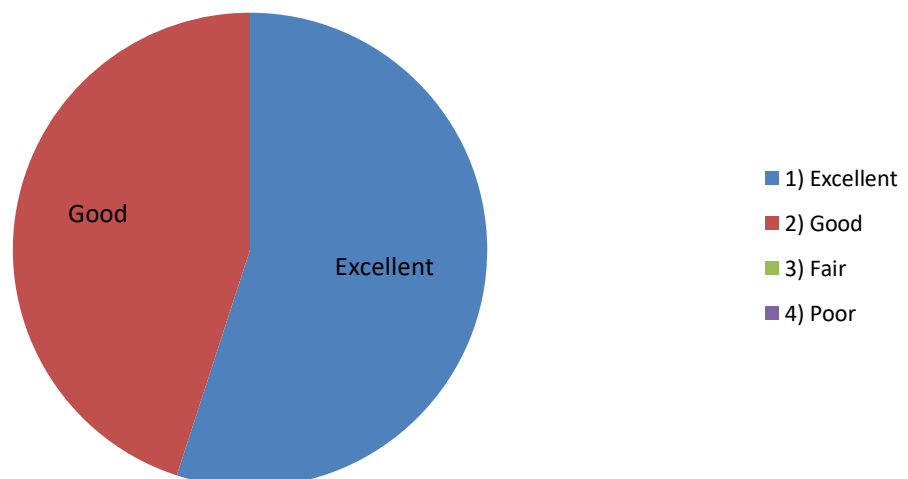
### 2. Are you comfortable with the timings of the college?



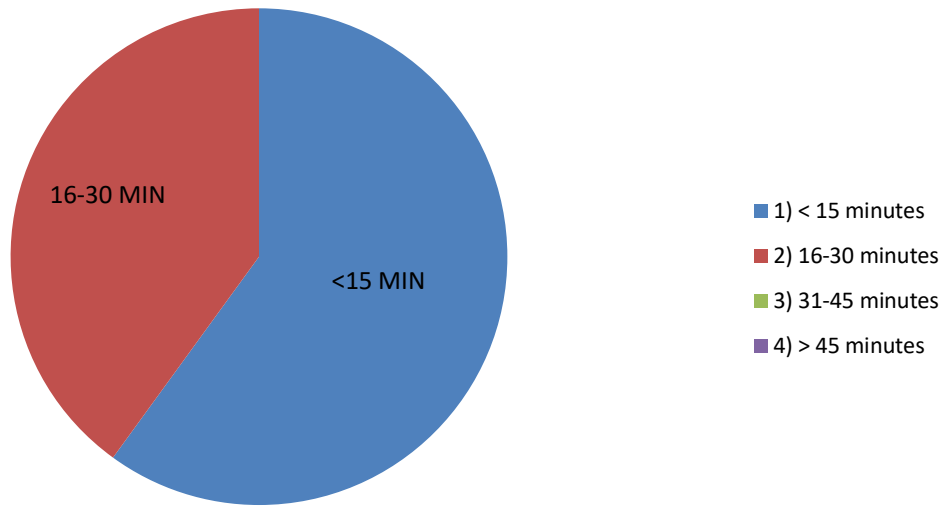
**3. Are you easily able to locate the department to avail treatment?**



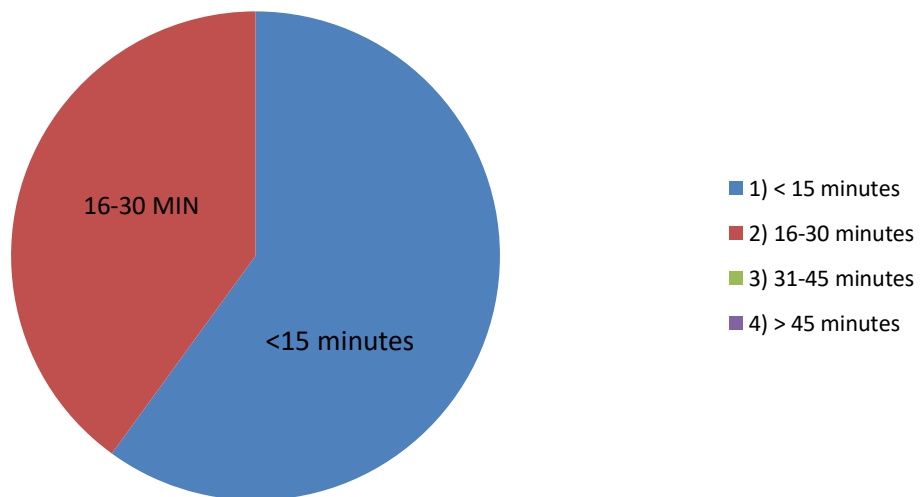

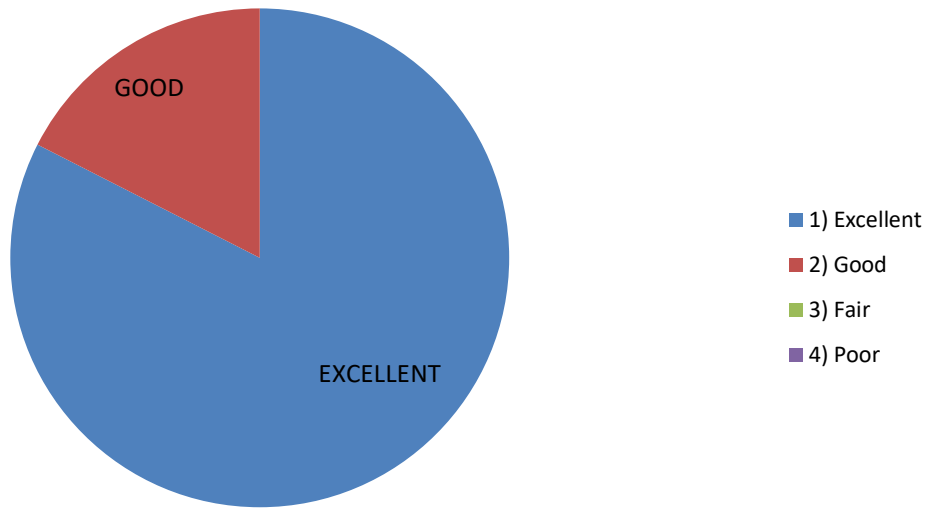
### 5. Time taken to meet the dentist?



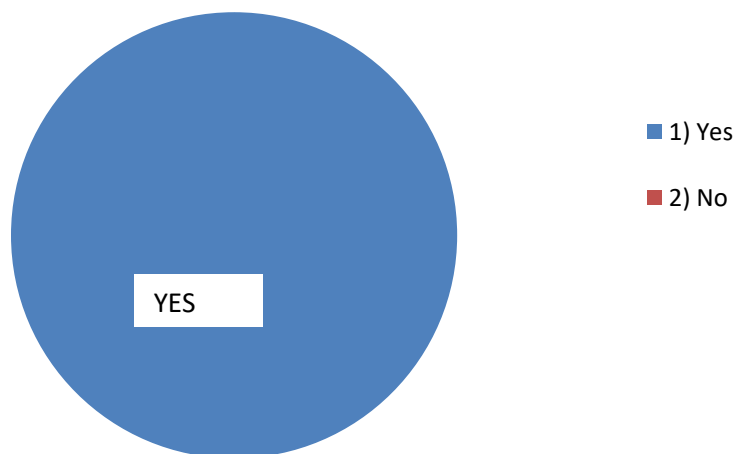

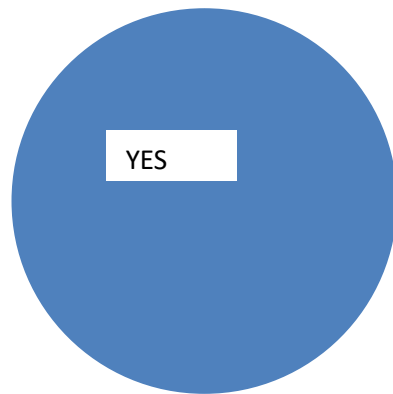

**8. Are the instruments used for dental treatment clean?**



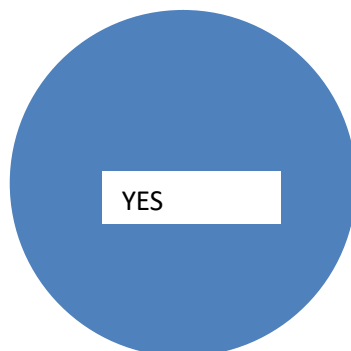

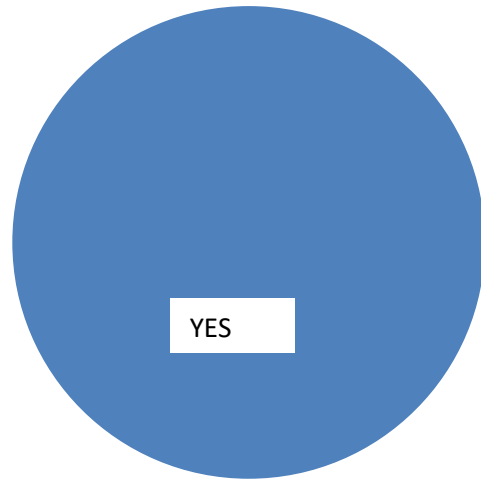
