
























STAKEHOLDER	FEED BACK ANALYSIS REPORT
Students	50-60% of the students felt excellent for the syllabus course in relation to the competencies, career orientation, syllabus content expected out of the course. About 50% of the students felt excellent for the syllabus generating interest in subject area and that curriculum gives scope for research and employability. More than 50% felt that chair side teaching was effective in delivering curriculum.
Faculty	80% of the faculty felt the syllabus is need based, objectives are well defined. About 60-65% felt the syllabus has cope for research and ensures student participation. 70% felt it was satisfactory in terms of add on topics and the syllabus is sufficient to cover course outcomes.
Employer	90% of employers felt the curriculum fulfils current needs, clinical practice is included in the syllabus. 70% felt there is scope for research and the curriculum covers the course outcomes. 82% felt it was excellent in terms of latest trends in the industry taught in the curriculum.
Alumni	90% felt excellent for the syllabus course in relation to the competencies, 75% felt excellent in career orientation. About 80% felt the curriculum generates interest in subject area and develops good scope for research and enhances employability.
Professional	98% felt the syllabus is need based, objectives are well defined, has cope for research and ensures student participation. $2-4$ % felt it was good in terms of add-on tpis and the syllabus is sufficient to cover course outcomes.
